SECURE THE FUTURE is an innovative, comprehensive, public-private initiative to fight HIV/AIDS in sub-Saharan Africa, where the needs of people infected with and affected by the disease are great and health care and other resources limited. The initiative supports research, community education and supportive services, training for doctors and other health care professionals, and the construction of new facilities and infrastructure.


A collaborative effort to fight the disease, it brings together government leaders, Ministries of Health, medical institutions in the U.S., Africa and Europe, physicians and other health care professionals, non-governmental, community-based and faith-based organizations, and people living with HIV/AIDS.

Bristol-Myers Squibb and the Bristol-Myers Squibb Foundation launched the initiative—the first and largest corporate commitment of its kind to fight HIV/AIDS in Africa—in 1999. Now, with \$150 million committed through more than 230 grants, SECURE THE FUTURE is sharing outcomes, experiences and lessons learned with people fighting the disease in developing countries around the world.

The work of SECURE THE FUTURE will continue in African communities in the years to come.

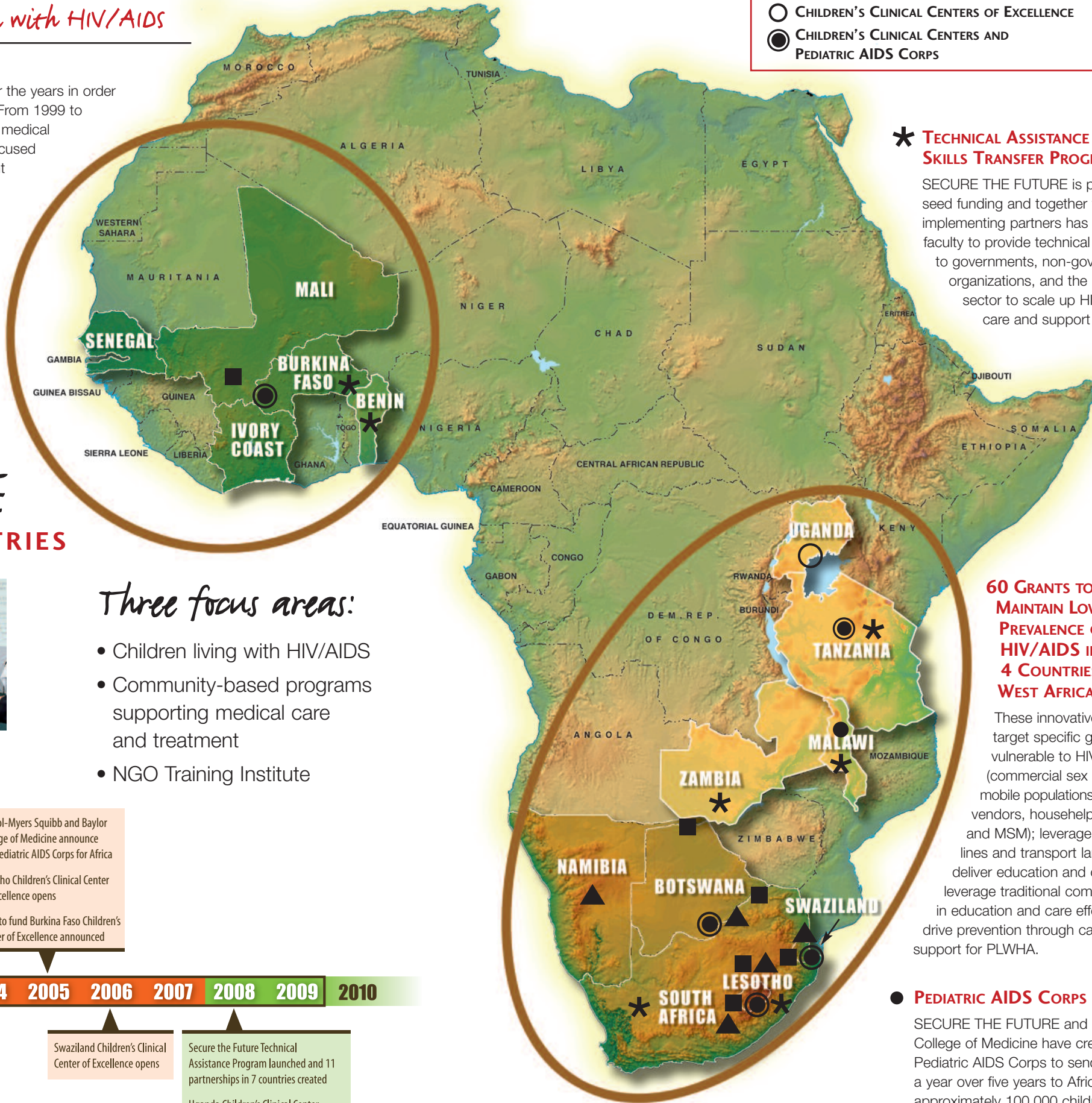
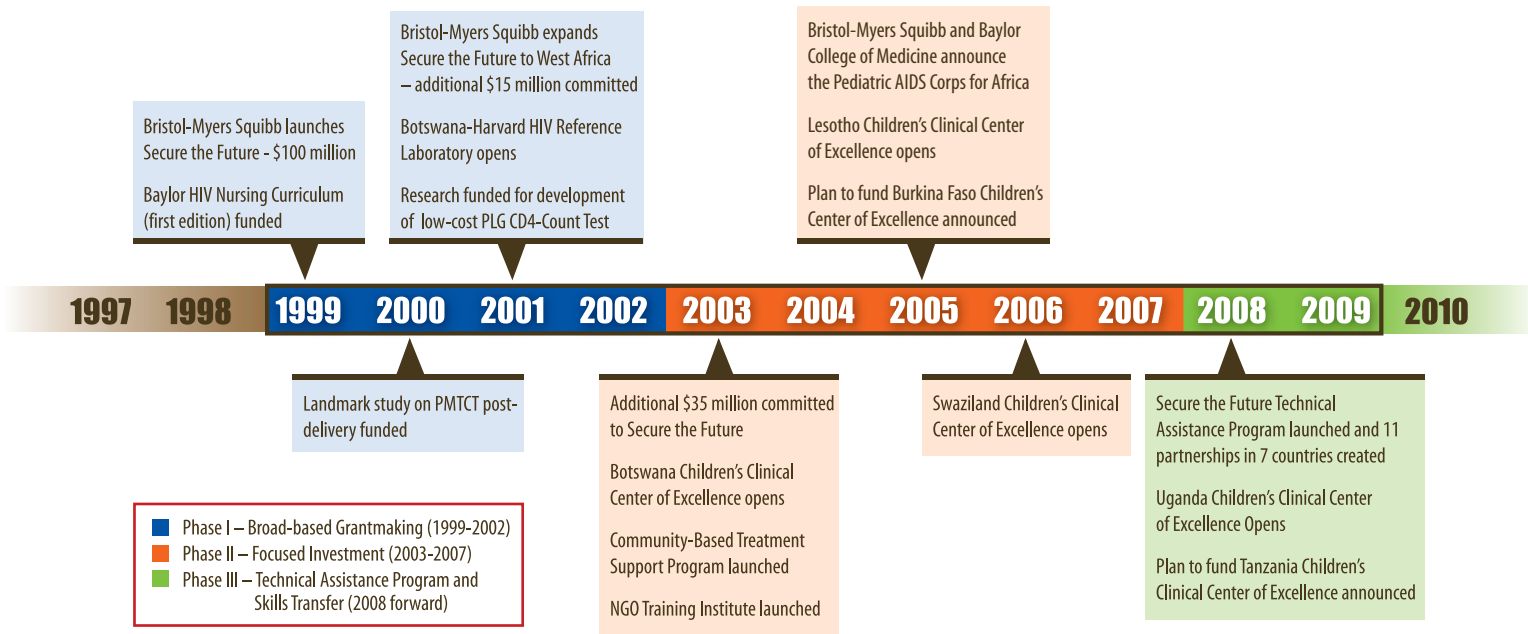

*** TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE AND SKILLS TRANSFER PROGRAM**
SECURE THE FUTURE is providing seed funding and together with its implementing partners has formed a faculty to provide technical assistance to governments, non-governmental organizations, and the private sector to scale up HIV/AIDS care and support in Africa.

■ COMMUNITY-BASED TREATMENT SUPPORT PROGRAM
Six pilot centers show that comprehensive medical treatment and care, including access to antiretroviral medicines, combined with broad-based community support can be successful in fighting HIV/AIDS in remote, poverty-stricken areas where resources are extremely limited.

▲ BRISTOL-MYERS SQUIBB FOUNDATION NGO TRAINING INSTITUTE
This first African NGO Training Institute is developing model training modules to build leadership, management and good governance skills among organizations working to fight HIV/AIDS.

60 GRANTS TO HELP MAINTAIN LOW PREVALENCE OF HIV/AIDS IN 4 COUNTRIES IN WEST AFRICA
These innovative grants target specific groups vulnerable to HIV infection (commercial sex workers, mobile populations, ambulatory vendors, househelp, prisoners and MSM); leverage railroad lines and transport lanes to deliver education and care; leverage traditional communicators in education and care efforts; and drive prevention through care and support for PLWHA.

○ CHILDREN'S HIV/AIDS CLINICAL CENTERS OF EXCELLENCE
SECURE THE FUTURE and Baylor College of Medicine opened the first clinical center in Africa focused on children with HIV/AIDS, located in Botswana. Additional Children's Clinical Centers of Excellence have opened in Lesotho, Swaziland and Uganda, with two more to be built in Burkina Faso and Tanzania.

● PEDIATRIC AIDS CORPS
SECURE THE FUTURE and Baylor College of Medicine have created the Pediatric AIDS Corps to send 50 doctors a year over five years to Africa to treat approximately 100,000 children and train local health care professionals.
